Polaris Partnership

El Sistema USA® (ESUSA) unveiled a new curriculum, A Musician's Guide to Reaching for the Stars, developed in collaboration with Polaris Dawn Mission Specialist Sarah Gillis, an accomplished musician and SpaceX engineer.

Inspired by Sarah Gillis's journey from classical violinist to space adventurer, A Musician's Guide to Reaching for the Stars encourages students to reach for their dreams and discover the connections between music, creativity, and exploration.

This was developed for a wide range of ages (3rd grade +) and classroom types. This is the perfect resource to use for summer learning. We would love it if you could share this resource with your network. The curriculum features Sarah and her crewmembers Jared, Scott, and Anna, along with music and space experts Rickey Minor, Jeri Lynne Johnson, Kevin Day, Joe Tanner, and Sue Levine.

Its five modules, each featuring videos and engaging activities called "Challenges," weave together elements of Sarah Gillis's personal story, an inside look at the Polaris Dawn crew's mission prep, musical activities, and self-reflection exercises. The five modules are titled: 1) Daring to Dream; 2) Joining a Stellar Crew; 3) Training for Life in Space; 4) Plotting the Mission Timeline; and 5) Looking Toward the Next Adventure.

The curriculum is not limited to classroom teachers—families at home, camp and after-school program counselors, teaching artists, and others working with young people can easily access the curriculum and engage with its activities in a variety of settings.

Sarah Gillis

This curriculum collaboration was a precursor to the Harmony of Resilience video that the Polaris Dawn Mission to Space released this September, in our new fiscal year, in partnership with El Sistema USA featuring El Sistema students globally! In the video, Sarah Gillis performed "Rey's Theme" by composer John Williams on her custom-made violin while in orbit aboard the Dragon spacecraft, launching her campaign to raise support for music education back on Earth. Her music selection, fittingly, was a piece from the film, Star Wars: The Force Awakens.

Gillis was joined in performance by youth musicians from around the world, all of them students in the international El Sistema network of organizations, specifically: the inaugural El Sistema program in Venezuela, The Boston String Academy in the United States, NEOJIBA in Brazil, Dream Orchestra in Sweden, Brass for Africa in Uganda, and BLUME Haiti. The video of their historic performance is the first-of-its-kind downloaded from space via Starlink high-speed internet, and has been viewed a BILLION times worldwide!

El Sistema USA is proud to collaborate with The Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University to offer up to two full cost of attendance scholarships to the Peabody Conservatory for Fall 2024. El Sistema USA accepts nominations from any El Sistema USA member organization. Since the inception of the El Sistema USA Fellowship at Peabody Conservatory in 2018, 8 students have been awarded full scholarships to attend Peabody. This year the scholarship was awarded to tuba player Valeria Perez Desiderio from Guaynabo, Puerto Rico of the Orquesta Sinfónica Juvenil de Puerto Rico.



National Standardized Student Survey Tool & Dashboard

ESUSA has launched a standardized student survey tool on social emotional indicators for all ESUSA member programs. ESUSA will collect pre and post surveys which will be matched to measure change over time. Programs can upload their survey data to an online dashboard which will allow programs to view the results and custom analysis of their individual program. ESUSA will also provide aggregated national data analysis. This standardized national survey tool and database will allow for organizations to tell their individual and collective stories of impact. ESUSA is working with Research Consultant, Deborah Ward, Ph.D and DART Analytics on this project.




FY 2024 Budget and Giving
